On your current project (or set of projects), what is the most acute resource shortfall that you have?



 - Foremen


As it relates to building material shortages, what is your view amongst the following?

 - Establishing a longer target schedule to recognize the shortage.
 - Using design assist to define specific tactics to support a strategy.

Where This Started: Zingerman's Delicatessen

- Zingerman's Delicatessen opened in March 1982 in a historic building near the Ann Arbor Farmers Market in Michigan.
- The Deli was founded by Paul Saginaw and Ari Weinzweig, two friends who dreamt of creating a traditional Jewish deli that would bring very special foods to Ann Arbor in a way that was unique to them.
- Needless to say, they succeeded! The founders ultimately created their own management training organization, called Zing Train.
- As part of this effort, they created their 12
 Natural Laws of Business.






Zing Train's 12 Natural Laws of Business

- 1. An inspiring, strategically sound vision leads the way to greatness (especially if you write it down!)
- 2. You need to give customers really compelling reasons to buy from you.
- 3. Without good finance you fail.
- 4. People do their best work when they're part of a really great organization.
- 5. If you want the staff to give great service to customers, the leaders have to give great service to the staff.
- 6. If you want great performance from your staff, you have to give them clear expectations and training tools.

- 7. Successful businesses do the things that others know they should do but generally don't.
- 8. To get to greatness you've got to keep getting better, all the time!
- 9. Success means you get better problems.
- 10. Whatever your strengths are, they will likely lead straight to your weaknesses.
- 11. It generally takes a lot longer to make something great happen than people think.
- 12. Great organizations are appreciative, and the people in them have more fun.





Rating Each Law: 1=Strongly Disagree. 10=Strongly Agree


Rating of Laws 7-12


