





Vision & Economic Overview:

Goal: Make Ohio the most prosperous economy in the U.S.

Status: Central Ohio leads economically in the Midwest and ranks highly nationwide.

Diversity: Business sector is diverse; the largest sector makes up only 17%.



Target Growth Sectors:

- Semiconductors
- Automotive
- Life Sciences
- Defense Technologies
- Data Centers
- Logistics
- Financial Services
- Insurance

Columbus is the #3 market for data centers, with strong industrial growth.



Population and Development:

- 90% of Ohio's population growth is centered in Columbus and nearby areas.
- One Columbus is actively pursuing manufacturing, office, and logistics opportunities.

Opportunities and Risks:

- Data Centers: Require large land and power resources.
- Housing: Shortage due to projected growth.
- Airport Expansion: New terminal presents major opportunity.
- Office Space: Renovation of older buildings is underway.
- **Utilities:** Power infrastructure is a key concern.
- Workforce Development: Need to train population for manufacturing jobs.



Panel Q&A Highlights:

- Labor Shortage: Trade partners and skilled labor are hard to find.
- Power Infrastructure: New power plants are being built.
- Prefabrication: Growing trend to reduce costs and labor needs.
- Joint Ventures: Increasing collaboration between subcontractors and firms.
- Education Gap: Fewer students graduating; companies are now focusing on developing willing candidates.
- Role of One Columbus: Can assist with competitive incentives and guidance.
- International Firms: Often lack design/construction professionals and pose cultural challenges.



Roundtable Discussion

As you prepare for the next 5 years in your company, what do you need from your project partners to help each other succeed?

- **Project Labor Agreements (PLAs)**: Mixed views; may be challenging in current climate.
- **Trade Recruitment**: Improve job site conditions to attract youth (e.g., better facilities, respect, awareness of trade benefits).
- Budgeting: Owners need to plan budgets better from the start.
- Legal & Regulatory: Hire attorneys early and engage reviewing agencies sooner.
- Engage reviewing agencies early.



What is your one key takeaway from today's roundtable that you can implement at your company:

- What we need from partners for success
- To maintain and advance the current growth in Central Ohio, we need to improve how we design and deliver projects, and how we engage with all project stakeholders.
- All in / collaborative mentality key to take on all that Columbus needs
- The pipeline remains strong
- Communication across all aspect is critical
- Importance of early partnering.
- The discussion on craft worker development was valuable and insightful
- Columbus future is bright
